Stan was ordained priest in Otley Parish Church on 29th September 1974 whilst serving his first curacy at Holy Trinity, Skipton. In August 1976 in moved to a second curacy at Bradford Cathedral. In 1978 he became a Team Vicar in the Grantham Parish with responsibility for the church of St John's, Spitalgate. In 1982 he was inducted into the Parish of Deeping St James on the very southern edge of the Lincoln Diocese -almost into this one. After 14 years there he moved on to be the incumbent of St Michael's, Middlewich with Byley-cum-Lees in the diocese of Chester. From there he moved north to the Stanwick Group of Parishes again right on the edge of a diocese, this time the northern edge of the diocese of Ripon. After several years he also became the Area Dean of the Richmond Deanery, one of the largest by area in the Church of England., He retired in 2012 when we moved into Irthlingborough in this diocese and has been a regular attender at St Mary's for the past ten years. He has spent over two years looking after the services and much more in this parish until a few weeks ago when we welcomed our new vicar the Rev Morna Simpson. We are grateful to her for allowing us to "take over" the service this morning to mark Stan's 50 years of devoted service to the priesthood.
